# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



or over 25 years, the Cuban American Bar Association has been the primary voice for the growing number of Cuban-American and Hispanic attorneys in this community.

Founded by pioneer Cuban-American lawyers who felt shut out of the existing legal establishment, CABA gave voice to their concerns regarding overt forms of discrimination against minority lawyers and provided a much needed forum for business networking and mutual support among the early pioneers of the Cuban-American legal community.

As the influence of Cuban-Americans in this community and nationally grew, so did CABA. Today, CABA is one of the most important and well respected voices for the Cuban American community both locally and nationally. With over 1500 members, CABA is also one of the strongest and fastest growing voluntary bar associations in this State.

CABA's success is a product of the clarity and effectiveness of our advocacy. This organization has a clear point of view cultivated by consensus which we will continue to pursue vigorously.

First and foremost, CABA stands for diversity in our profession. We will not tolerate and will fight to abolish any barriers to the full, fair and complete integration of the legal profession. And we will leave no one behind. CABA has and will continue to use our clout to promote not just qualified Cuban-Americans and Hispanic lawyers, but also women and African-American lawyers to positions of authority at all levels of the legal profession.

In this respect, CABA has been most vocal in calling and fighting for a diverse judiciary. In the past few years, CABA has achieved some of our long stated diversity goals. CABA members have been named to nearly a dozen new circuit and country judgeships; two lifetime federal court appointments, to the position of U.S. Attorney for the Southern District of Florida ; to our State's intermediate Courts of Appeal and, to the Florida Supreme Court. And you ain't seen nothing yet. CABA will not rest until the composition of our local judiciary closely parallels the diverse, ethnic, racial and gender make-up of our community.

CABA also will continue to rigorously defend the right of every citizen of this State to participate in the selection of our state court judiciary through direct judicial elections. While other bar groups have given up on democracy and are advocating for various forms of elitist judicial screening and selection, CABA remains at the forefront of reforming the judicial election process through landmark campaign finance reform and better voter education. While others stand on the sidelines bemoaning the flaws of the current system, CABA will lead, continuing to set the agenda for judicial selection and election reform in this State.

In this respect, we will continue to recognize those individuals and organization and elected officials who support our mission and objectives. We have many powerful friends who have helped propel us to the forefront on issues of judicial selection and diversity. CABA will and must do a better job of acknowledging these allies and enlisting them in our on-going efforts.

With our growing influence also comes increased responsibility. We must strengthen and expand the CABA pro bono project—which offers free legal assistance in Spanish to thousands of needy persons. Our scholarship programs now established at three area law schools must be fully endowed and expanded. Our bi-monthly seminar program and quarterly newsletter should be institutionalized and made as relevant and interesting to our members as is possible.

Most importantly, we must continue to be the primary forum for promoting interaction and friendship between Cuban-American and Hispanic attorneys and anyone else interested in supporting our needs and concerns.

Finally, let us never forget that some day soon, CABA may also be called upon to restore the rule of law in a free Cuba. We must prepare ourselves and our community for this day. And we must never forget that helping to realize the exile dream of a free and democratic Cuba is also part of CABA's mission.
